BUFFALO & ERIE COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY JOINS THE WNY LITERACY INITIATIVE

Buffalo, August 1, 2023 – The WNY Education Alliance is pleased to announce that the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library has become the 25th partner in the WNY Literacy Initiative.

The WNY Literacy Initiative is a collaborative effort comprised of teachers, parent groups, community organizations, education non-profits, librarians, and literacy experts, including the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library, Buffalo Mayor Byron W. Brown and the City of Buffalo, the Buffalo NAACP, the Buffalo Police Athletic League, the Buffalo Sabres Foundation, the Buffalo Urban League, the Community Action Organization of WNY, Dyslexia Allies of WNY, Dyslexia Services of WNY, The Education Trust — New York, Literacy Buffalo Niagara, Monkey See, Monkey Do...Children's Bookstore, Neuhaus Education Center, the New York State Network For Youth Success & the Afterschool Network of Western New York, The Niagara Frontier Reading Council, the Parent Network of Western New York, Project FLIGHT, The Reading League, Read to Succeed Buffalo, Say Yes Buffalo, Teach My Kid to Read, Villa Maria College, We the Parents of WNY, WNY Education Alliance, and the WNY Literacy Collaborative.

The mission of the WNY Literacy Initiative is to increase awareness of the importance of literacy and improve literacy rates in Western New York through community outreach, professional development opportunities for local educators, and research and advocacy.

Tarja Parssinen, founder of WNY Education Alliance, commented: "We are excited to partner with the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library on this important initiative. Public libraries play a key role in promoting literacy by providing residents with access to books and other educational resources, including the internet. Familes with young children and struggling readers often seek support from public libraries in their efforts to teach their children to read, particularly in underserved communities. Librarians often serve as our 'literacy first responders.' Therefore, it is critical to ensure that our public libraries and librarians are equipped – with both an understanding of the science of reading and decodable book resources – to help those who are looking to learn to read. Several



partners in the initiative, including the Buffalo Sabres Foundation and Teach My Kid to Read, have been working together to create literacy hubs in school libraries in Buffalo. By adding the Buffalo & Erie County Library to the WNY Literacy Initiative, we hope to create innovative partnerships that support the public libraries in our region and complement the ongoing efforts to improve access to decodable books in our schools."

The Honorable Byron W. Brown was sworn in to a fifth term as the 62nd Mayor of New York's second largest city in January of 2022. Mayor Brown is a long-time champion of Buffalo's students, especially as it relates to literacy. He established his Reading Rules! Kids Summer Reading Challenge over 20 years ago in an effort to "maximize the reading potential of our youth and encourage their developmental success." Over 25,000 students have completed the Summer Reading Challenge since the inception of this program.
